CONSERVATIVE TIDBITS RANDOM THOUGHTS...

Once again, we were unable to hold our Annual Conservative Dinner. We expect to renew the tradition next year. / Our endorsed candidates in the Town of Rush (Phyllis Wickerham, Ryan Lang and James Kolb) were challenged in a Conservative Primary. They defeated their opponents by totals of 4 to 1 or better. Congratulations and thank you to all who worked on the campaign. / On September 18, 2021, Don Mazzullo was unanimously elected to his first full term as Chairman of the Monroe County Conservative Party. / The so-called "bail reform" imposed on New Yorkers is an unmitigated disaster. Crime rates are climbing everywhere, as defendants are apprehended and then immediately released, free to commit more crimes. In some instances, the revolving door has resulted in giving an individual the freedom to commit (allegedly) 10 or more crimes with little or no consequence! / It is reported that in New York City one individual was arrested and released more than 50 times! Matters will only get worse as more and more perpetrators learn how easy it is to game the system. / And the answer of the Black Lives Matter crowd is to defund the police! In fact, the most recent New York State Budget authorizes the State to withhold State and Federal Funds from jurisdictions that fail to produce a "Police Reform Plan." Hopefully these "reforms" won't be as disastrous as "bail reform." / Some State Senate Democrats are trying to top this dysfunction, and they have introduced a bill that would require the records of felons to be sealed after they have been released from prison for a certain period of time. Imagine living in a world where you couldn't find out whether your handyman or office employee had

committed a serious crime such as burglary, arson or even murder, on the theory that judging a person by past actions is unfair, but a lawabiding citizen could suffer serious consequences or be "cancelled" because they said or committed a "politically incorrect" but legal act decades before. The world is upside down! / New York State has a budget larger than the states of Florida and Texas combined, although those states have a combined population more that 21/2 times New York's. So why does the leftist media constantly harp on the alleged failings of Governor DeSantis and Governor Abbott? We're the ones with the problem. / Speaking of which, former Governor Andrew Cuomo has thankfully resigned. Although most of the attention has been focused on his reported sexual harassment of subordinates, his allegedly disastrous nursing home policies and subsequent cover-up, and his alleged misuse of government resources to land a \$5.1 million book deal, are also serious issues. / The State Budget contains \$2.1 billion for direct payments to illegal aliens, and \$10 million to provide free immigration attorneys to illegal aliens. What is it about the word "illegal" that is difficult to understand? / The Monroe County Conservative Party has enthusiastically endorsed Lee Zeldin for Governor. He has been endorsed by the overwhelming majority of Conservatives and Republicans in the State and is the presumptive nominee of both parties next year. The State's decline will only be reversed by reversing the mistakes made under Democratic control. To fully accomplish this Lee will need to be joined by Republicans in the Senate and Assembly./When did the word "migration" get substituted for

"invasion?" Perhaps a huge influx of undocumented foreigners is called an invasion when it is resisted, and not when it is actively encouraged by the government in power. / If you wanted to weaken the country, you could not do better than to pursue policies which will bankrupt the country and debase our currency, functionally eliminate our borders, degrade our military preparedness by introducing woke concepts at all levels of the command structure, encourage critical race theory to be taught in our schools, thereby sowing divisions in the population and reducing respect for our culture, laws and history, pay people not to work, thus destroying our work ethic and initiative, pressure states and local authorities to adopt policies which threaten to eliminate free and fair elections, and issue unconstitutional mandates which will gradually reduce our opposition to government control in our lives. The current administration is pursuing some version of all of these policies. / Many of the same people who are savaging the red states for even suggesting the use of Voter ID cards (even though picture ID cards are available to drivers and non-drivers in all 50 states already) are demanding that citizens provide proof of vaccination for many purposes. Such people are either confused or have an agenda. / President Trump's personality may be extremely distasteful to many, but to those who voted against him for that reason rather than due to a disagreement with his policies, I have one question: Are you happy now? / The people at Twitter banned President Trump but refused to ban the spokesman for the Taliban. Way to go! / So many indignities, so little space.

ELECTION 2021 AND BEYOND!

The Monroe County Conservative Party had a solid showing last year. In the countywide races we averaged almost 21,000 votes. Our top endorsed candidate for Supreme Court Justice received 23,864 votes on Row C. This with only 8,200 enrolled Conservatives. All four of our Supreme Court candidates were victorious, and in three of those races we were the **margin of victory**.

This year we have endorsed 122 candidates for public office, including 2 Supreme Court Justices, 3 County Court Judges, 20 County Legislators, almost all Town Supervisors and half of the Town Council members and Town Justices.

Two of our candidates for County Court are running important and competitive races. Marty McCarthy is currently a Chili Town Justice and Supreme Court Law Clerk, and previously served as a Monroe County Assistant District Attorney and as a private practitioner. This breadth of experience makes him ideally suited to the role of County Court Judge. Julie Hahn is the Chief of the Major Felony Bureau of the Monroe County District Attorney's office. In that role, she has been lead prosecutor in many trials involving the most heinous crimes perpetrated in our region. In these days of chaos and lawlessness her perspective and experience are sorely needed. Judge Jim Walsh, Elena Cariola, and Judge Caroline

Edwards-Morrison round out our slate of excellent judicial candidates running countywide.

Finally, our endorsed candidates for County Legislature are battling to retain control. There are 20 contested seats, and the Republicans hold a narrow 15-14 majority. The future of the County could be determined by a few hotly contested races. The Monroe County Conservative Party intends to play a pivotal role in the future of Monroe County elections.

Next year, Congressional races and extremely important races for Governor and the State Legislature will be held. It is clear that New York State is at a crossroads, and that a change of direction is imperative.

INFRASTRUCTURE, A.K.A. SOCIALISM

Ballot Propositions 3 and 4

In addition to candidates, this year's ballots will contain two propositions which the Conservative Party strongly opposes.

Proposition 3 would eliminate the requirement that citizens register to vote at least 10 days before an election. The Proposition would allow same-day registration and would thus make it more difficult to ensure that only those qualified to vote are allowed to do so.

Proposition 4 would allow no-excuse absentee voting, in other words voting by mail. Voting by mail allows ballot harvesting and introduces unnecessary complexities into the election process. In most cases people can and should perform their civic duty by showing up and voting in person.

And while you're at the polls, vote **NO** on **Propositions 3 and 4!**
